The Michigan Public Service Commission (Commission) will hold a hearing to consider DTE Electric Company's (DTE Electric) September 28, 2018 application for authority to implement a Power Supply Cost Recovery (PSCR) plan in its rate schedules for 2019 metered jurisdictional sales of electricity. DTE Electric is seeking Commission approval to include a maximum PSCR Factor of a 1.81 mills per kWh in customers' bills for the period January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019, and approval of the expense associated with DTE Electric's agreements with NEXUS Gas Transmission, to provide firm natural gas transportation for 30,000 Dth per day with an assumed in-service date of October 1, 2018, increasing to 75,000 Dth per day when DTE Electric has commissioned the BWEC natural gas power plant. DTE Electric is also seeking approval of the PSCR expense associated with the voluntary green programs.
