The Michigan Public Service Commission (Commission) will hold a public hearing to consider DTE Electric Company's (DTE Electric) September 21, 2018 application to retroactively address the impacts of federal corporate tax reduction arising from the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017 (TCJA) on its electric rate base rates from January 1, 2018 through July 31, 2018. DTE Electric requests the Commission to approve the Credit B refund including interest of \$92.7 million to customers over a six-month period from January 2019 through June 2019 bill cycles and grant other relief.
