# JUNE 5, 2024 Huron County Planning Commission Minutes

A meeting of the Huron County Planning Commission was held on Wednesday, June 5, 2024, in the Huron County Building, 250 E Huron Ave, Rm 305, Bad Axe, MI 48413.

#### 1. Call Meeting to Order

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Bill Renn at 7:01 p.m. with the Pledge to the United States of America. Secretary Richard Swartzendruber called the roll of members: Roll call – Members present: Bernie Creguer, Deborah Knarian, George Lauinger, Richard Swartzendruber, Jeremy Polega, Bill Renn, Todd Talaski, J. Dean Smith, and James Leonard. Approximately eight quests were in attendance.

Member Talaski made a motion and seconded by Member Polega to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried.

## 2. Approval of Minutes

Member Smith made a motion, seconded by Member Creguer, to approve the May 1, 2024, regular meeting minutes. Motion carried.

Paul Funk, DTE, thanked the Planning Commission for their hard work on the solar & battery energy storage ordinances. They are excited to see the ordinances go to a public hearing. He offered to provide input to the commissioners, if requested.

## **6.** Reports of Committees: Campground, Mobile Home, and RV Park committee

Jeff Smith shared pictures of structures being built and attached to RVs at Duggan's Campground. According to EGLE - State of Michigan, these structures may be in violation because they are attached to the RV. Even with a structure that is approved (porch, deck, or 3-season sunroom), there is supposed to be a minimum 4-foot buffer around each RV. The accessory structure is supposed to be free-standing. He is waiting for additional feedback/guidance from EGLE. Members discussed the difference between RV's and Mobile Homes in existing campgrounds and mobile home parks.

#### 7. Unfinished Business:

A. Commercial Solar Energy Facilities Ordinance & Battery Energy System ordinances. Review updated versions dated 6-3-2024.

Member Lauinger took the draft copy with Corporation Counsel's annotations and cleaned up the format and index/numbering on the solar ordinance and battery ordinance. Member Knarian had sent Member Lauinger a list of four items that were included in the solar ordinance but were not in the battery ordinance.

- Lot coverage (15%) exemption The other provisions contained within 15.02.9.5 would still apply. On the Battery ordinance, page 4 #6 will address the lot coverage and the current #6 will become #7.
- Decommissioning needs to be addressed in the battery ordinance. Members discussed bonding, vegetation buffers, hazardous material disposal, soil testing, setbacks, requiring KMZ files, consultant fees, and false complaints.

**9. Final Public Comment**: Public input protocol (3 minutes per speaker):

Keith Iseler, Huron Township, stated he is not a fan of the state of Michigan taking over renewable energy zoning. We have heard from the State that each municipality is entitled to create their own zoning, however it shall not be too restrictive or prohibitive.

Paul Funk, DTE, stated he will return next month and thanked the Commission for their questions.

## **10**. Final Planning Commission Comment:

Member Knarian would like to discuss bonds and/or financial assurances for renewable energy projects along with decommissioning.

Being there was no further business to come before the Planning Commission, Member Swartzendruber made a motion, seconded by Member Creguer, to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried. Adjournment was at 8:59 p.m.
